### One Man's Trash, Another's Treasure

- 1. Jose Gutierrez drives a garbage truck for a living. He picked up garbage from wealthy neighbourhoods of Bagota in Columbia. One day, about 20 years ago, he found a copy of Anna Karenina, the famous novel by Leo Tolstoy. Somebody had thrown it into the trash. Soon he began to find more and more books. He brought them all home-50 to 60 each day.
- 2. Jose had studied only up to second grade because the family was too poor to afford school. But his mother always read to him at night and this gave him a life-long love for reading. Now as he looked at the books he had collected, he had an idea.
- 3. He realized that books were luxurious for children from nieghbourhoods such as his. And so, he set up a small reading room on the ground floor of his home -for free. He called it 'La Fuerza de las Palabrs', or 'The strength of words'. Here, the neighbourhood children came every weekend. The children in Jose's neighbourhood didn't have many books at home and no access to a local library, so they were grateful. Soon parents came to him asking to borrow books that would help their children prepare for school.
- 4. The news spread and people started donating books. Soon Jose had a collection of almost 20,000 books. They filled the rooms from floor to ceiling. Jose took books to poor parts of the city or remote areas which had no libraries. Since then, he has donated reading materials to schools, institutions and community libraries across Columbia.
