 - The Rio Grande is not the longest river in America, but it counts among one of the most important rivers in the country. The reason for that is its location. The river has been serving as the official border between Texas and Mexico since 1846. The literal meaning of Rio Grande is Big River. However, the river is known in Mexico as Rio Bravo. This translates into the 'furious river'. Its curving route and sharp twists and turns, the river seems to be in a terrible rage.
 - 2. Rio Grande is the fourth or the fifth longest river in America. This varies according to the varying length of the river. Because the river twists so much, it frequently changes its course and its length. Officially, it is 3,051 km in length.
 - 3. The river starts in Colorado and has its mouth in the Gulf of Mexico. Downwards is the best word to describe the movement of the river. It flows from north to south as well from high mountains to lower lands before plunging in the gulf.
 - 4. Rio Grande is also unique in a way that this river cannot be navigated by ocean-going vehicles. The Rio Grande with its fertile valley, along with its tributaries, is a vital source of drinking water for seven US and Mexican states, and flows primarily through arid and semi-arid lands.
 - 5. However, the river is slowly drying up. Parts of it are already dry. This is caused by the voluminous consumption of water required to irrigate farmland and to continually hydrate cities. Experts are engaged in trying to solve this problem.
 - 6. Perhaps the greatest significance of the river is that it is a symbol of cooperation between the people of Mexico and Texas. The water of the river is used by the people on either side of the border. It acts as a border but also as a common space. Today, Rio Grande stands as a symbol of peace and friendship between two nations and its people.
